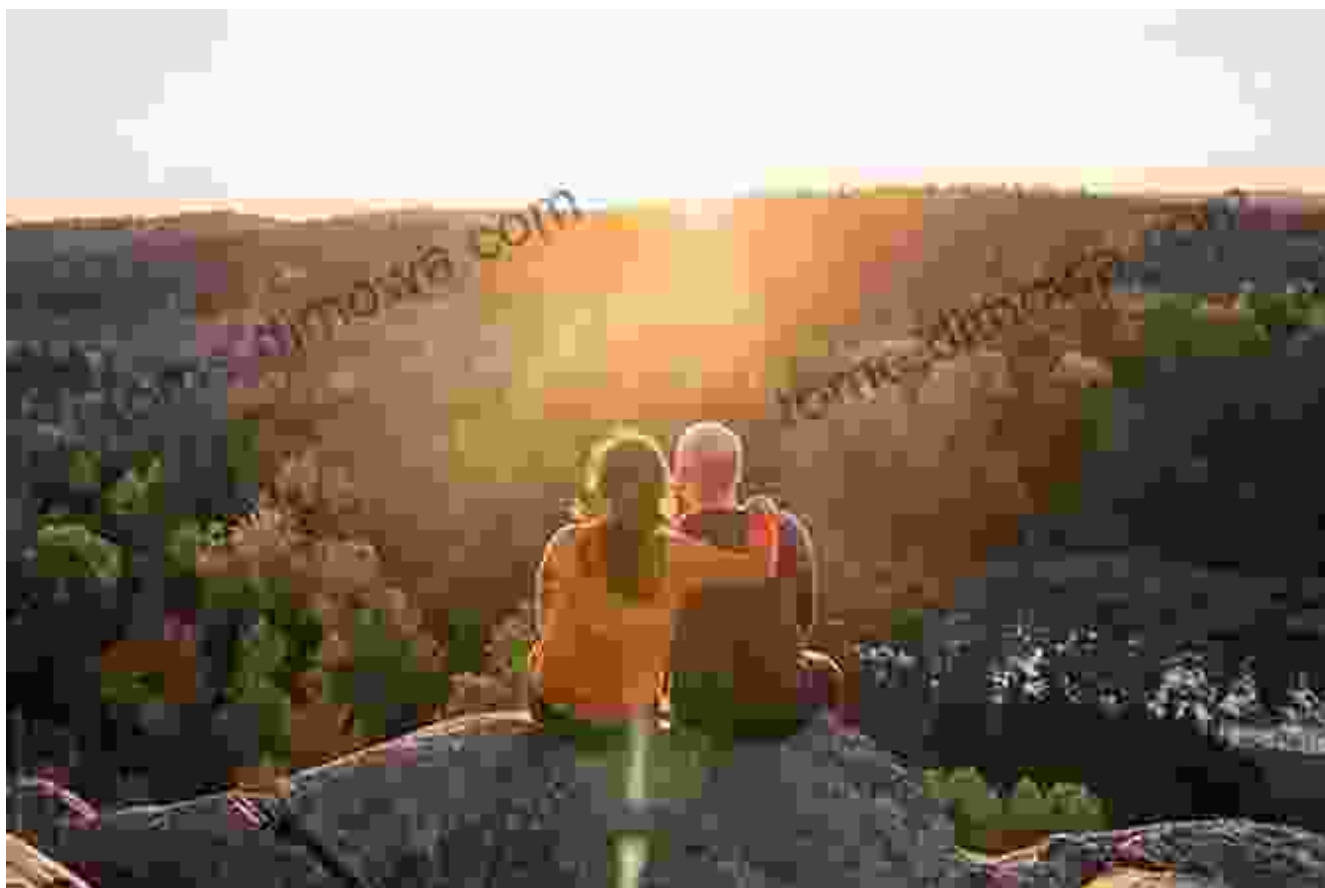

THE LEAVE NO TRACE SEVEN PRINCIPLES

- 1. PLAN AHEAD AND PREPARE**
Know the regulations and special concerns for the area you're visiting for extreme weather, hazards, and emergencies. Schedule your trip to avoid times of high use. Split large groups when possible. Consider splitting larger groups into smaller groups. Repackage food to fit your needs. Check that each camper is equipped with a means of handling pain, sickness or blisters.
- 2. TRAVEL AND CAMP ON DURABLE SURFACES**
Durable surfaces include established trails and campsites, rock, gravel, dry grasses or tundra. Protect riparian areas by camping at least 200 feet from lakes and streams. Good campsites are found not made. Steering a tent is not essential. In camp areas, concentrate use on existing trails and campsites. Walk single file in the middle of the trail from where you dismount. Keep campsite neat. Focus activity in areas where vegetation is absent or grows back. Digress only to prevent the creation of campsites and trails. Avoid places where impacts are just beginning.
- 3. DISPOSE OF WASTE PROPERLY**
Pack it in, pack it out. Respect your campsite and surroundings for trash or spilled food. Pack out all trash, leftover food and litter. Deposit your human waste in a cathole dug 6 to 8 inches deep, at least 200 feet from water campgrounds. Cover and disguise the catholes. Pack out toilet paper and hygiene products. To wash yourself or your clothes, carry water 200 feet away from campsites and use small amounts of biodegradable soap. Scatter and dispose of wastewater.
- 4. LEAVE WHAT YOU FIND**
Preserve natural and cultural resources and artifacts. Leave rocks, plants and other natural objects as you find them. Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species. Do not build structures, furniture or dig trenches.
- 5. MINIMIZE CAMPFIRE IMPACTS**
Campfires can cause lasting impacts to the landscape. Use a lightweight stove for cooking and enjoy a candle lantern for light. Where fires are permitted, use established fire rings, fire pits, or mounds of rocks. Never burn oil. Only use sticks from the ground that can be broken by hand. Burn all wood and sticks to dry out in unpopulated conditions. Never burn oily or oily items.
- 6. RESPECT WILDLIFE**
Observe wildlife from a distance. Do not follow or approach them. Never feed animals. Feeding wildlife disrupts their habits, alters natural behaviors, and exposes them to predators and other dangers. Protect wildlife and your food by storing carcasses and trash securely. Control pets at all times or leave them at home. Avoid wildlife during sensitive times: nesting, raising young, or migrating.
- 7. BE CONSIDERATE OF OTHER VISITORS**
Respect other visitors and protect the quality of their experience. Yield to hikers on the trail. Stay to the downhill side of the trail when encountering other hikers. Take breaks and stand away from trails and other visitors, by nature's scenic points. Avoid loud voices and noise.

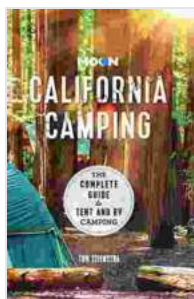
